

Lilacs

The Agincourt Beauty Lilac has deep purple fragrant flowers that are single, and each floret is very large; --- the largest florets of all lilacs. It is one of the best purple available today. It does tolerate light shade, but best bloom quality and disease resistance occur in full sun. Grows 10-12'. Z 3-7.



Lilacs come in 7 different colors White, Lilac, Pink, Violet, Magenta, Purple, and Blue. They can have single, double, and multi-petaled flowers and bloom early, mid-season, or late spring.



Annabel Lilac

One the best early blooming pink lilacs. Full doubled flowers and good fragrance. One of the earliest lilacs to bloom. (S. x hycinthiflora, Hawkins). 6-9' [z2-9]

Primrose

Syringa vulgaris

8-10'hx10-12'. Exceptionally fragrant blooms are superb for cutting—the perfume will fill your whole house! Carefree and vigorous, they require very little maintenance. Heart-shaped leaves make the perfect backdrop for the intensely fragrant blossoms. Ideal specimen planting or as a bushy hedge.

MISS CANADA LILAC

- *Syringa x prestoniae*

6' -12' tall and wide. 'Miss Canada' is the truest pink of any Lilac we have seen! Called "a priceless Lilac treasure" by the late Father Fiala, this Prestonian Hybrid offers brilliant clear pink flowers about a week later than the S. vulgaris types. Endowed with a rich, powerful "oriental" fragrance 'Miss Canada' offers sporadic blooms all summer. Space Lilacs 6 to 12 feet apart

This Lilac is very attractive to hummingbirds and butterflies, and is ultra-hardy. Z: 2-7



Charles Joly - Syringa vulgaris

(10''h X 8'w) Has vigor to produce bigger, better blossoms--and more of them. Exceptionally fragrant, too. The thick, sweet-scented clusters are superb for cutting--the perfume will fill your whole house! They produce a profusion of flowers and foliage- a feast for your senses- and seem equally attractive to birds, butterflies and hummingbirds. Even when they're not in bloom, many add interest to the landscape. Shrubs grow fast, last nearly forever and require a minimum care. Z 3-7



Sensation -Syringa vulgaris

10-15' tall. Dramatic, bicolor blooms of purple elegantly trimmed in white, cover this delicately scented lilac in early to mid spring, filling the air with their aroma. Beautiful as a border or a hedge. Adds flair to cut-flower bouquets. Z 3-7

Space out the blooming season



Monge Lilac, *Syringa vulgaris*
'Monge' is an outstandingly showy and fragrant French Hybrid Lilac that produces an abundance of red-purple single flowers in May. It is a consistent heavy bloomer and it has the true lilac scent.

Dwarf and compact lilac varieties include: *S. julianae* '**George Eastman**', *S. 'Josee'* a fall rebloomer, **Miss Canada** a late blooming compact variety, and **S. v. 'Wonderblue'** a mid-season blue lilac.

Late blooming (*S. patula* & *S. prestonae*) *lilacs*, typically the end of May and include: **Miss Kim**, **Miss Canada**

Early blooming (*Syringa hyanthiflora*) *lilacs* include: the dark purple **Pocahontas**

Mid-season Lilacs include all the *Syringa vulgaris* which make up the majority of all the lilacs.



Katherine Havemeyer Lilac

An early blooming French Hybrid that produces abundant clusters of double, lavender-pink, fragrant flowers among dark green, disease & mildew resistant foliage makes this one a whole lot better than other lilacs. Grows 10-12' tall Z 3-7



Bloomerrang Lilac

Dwarf, reblooming lilac with clusters of purple-pink, sweet scented flowers covering its branches in spring, continuing off and on until frost. Bloomerang™ fits in small spaces and is an excellent choice for a fragrant, low hedge. Z 4- 7



Pocahontas Lilac, *Syringa x hyacinthiflora* 'Pocahontas'
A floriferous Lilac displaying deep maroon-purple buds that open into single, deep violet fragrant flowers in spring. It blooms before the French Hybrid Lilacs and has the true lilac scent. It begins to flower while still young in age. It is an extremely vigorous, hardy.

10-12' high Zones 2-7



Miss Kim Lilac

Grows 6-7'. Thought to be the number one lilac in the Mid West. has an abundance of fragrant blossoms in spring that are dark lavender-pink in bud and fade to a very soft lavender-pink when fully opened. Wonderful foundation plant. Zones 3-7.



George Eastman' Syringa juliana
 A true color breakthrough with magnificent wine-red buds, which open to deep cerise-pink flowers! At only 4-6' mature height, this superb dwarf Lilac fits perfectly in smaller spaces in the landscape



Madame "Mme" Lemoine Lilac
 This lilac is loved for its hardiness and ability to produce masses of creamy white, heavily scented flowers through-out early summer.
 Grows 8-10' tall Zones 3- 7



Cheyenne' Lilac Syringa
oblata var. *dilatata*
 Blooms 7 to 10 days earlier than common lilacs, it forms a symmetrical plant with pink buds opening to single light blue flowers. Very fragrant! One of the few lilacs to exhibit significant fall color. Grows to 10' (in about 10 years).



Dappled Dawn (Aucubaefolia) Lilac
Syringa vulgaris
 Grows 8-10'. deep blue-purple buds that have fragrant blossoms. The leaves have an irregular yellow variegation, as if they were splashed with yellow. This variegated foliage is the unique feature of this lilac and adds summer color to the shrub border.



President Grevy Lilac, *Syringa vulgaris*
 An upright, vigorously growing French Hybrid Lilac growing 10-12' high with double, lilac-blue, fragrant flowers in May. A strong, long lived shrub that will give a lifetime of flowering satisfaction.



Avalanche
Syringa vulgaris
 'Avalanche' is showy and freely produces panicles of large, single white fragrant florets on a rounded to upright plant of 9 feet. It blooms in late spring to early summer. Z 3-9

More *Lilacs*



Edward J. Gardner Lilac
 Grows 10', double pink flowers bloom for several weeks in late spring, the best double pink flowered lilac



Purple Glory
Syringa x hyacinthiflora
 Grows 10-12' new variety that has been bred for flower production and deep purple flowers. also blooms later than common lilacs to extend the blooming season



Cheyenne Lilac
 It reaches a height and spread of about 8' and has dense, symmetrical growth. The highly-fragrant flowers are a distinctive and delicate shade of light blue—different from most other lilacs. Blooms 7-10 days earlier than the common lilac.
