### Fruit Trees

All trees are "semi-dwarf" unless otherwise noted.

Plant 15'-20' apart. Mature height 10-12'.

Plant 2 or 3 different varieties for cross-pollination

#### Apples

Apple trees usually produce heavily every other year.

Apple trees provide fruit and beauty. After enjoying gorgeous flowers, one can begin looking forward to the fruit apple trees produce. Fresh fruit is simply better and tastier than bin stored apples that are sold in supermarkets. There are many varieties of apple trees, all with taste, size, color, and harvest time variations. Apples do not freeze until the temperature drops to 28.5°F in storage or outside.

**The bud union (located where the scion meets the rootstock) should not be buried in the ground when planting. Keep the bud union about 2 inches above the ground when planting.**

**01K Cortland Apple:** {8 potted} 5-7' (\$35) Should produce this year. A heavy annual cropper that bares large size red striped fruit. Excellent for all uses. Lowest acid content of all the apples. [4]

**02K McIntosh Apple:** {10} 4-6' (\$25) Bright to dark red skin over sweet, crisp, subacid white flesh. Tart spicy flavor with a wonderful aroma. Resistant to cedar apple rust Ripens Sept. [4]

**03K Haralson Apple:** {10} 4-6' (\$23.50) Malus 'Haralson', is a hardy substitute for Golden Delicious developed especially for cold northern areas. Good baking, eating and cider apple. Flesh is crisp, juicy, firm. Mildly tart flavor, not acid. Holds its shape and texture in baking. Retains good flavor in keeping. [4].

**04K Honeycrisp Apple:** {10} 4-6' (\$23.50) This apple is honey sweet with a hint of tart and exceptionally crisp! Honeycrisp is the most requested apple variety we have had in a long time! Spotted red over a yellow background with juicy, crisp cream-colored flesh. Excellent for fresh eating and salads, good for baking, & an excellent keeper. Honeycrisp is a good choice for the home gardener or commercial growers. A mid season apple ripening from mid September to mid October depending on the growing location. A cross of Macoun and Honeygold. [4].

**05K Liberty Apple:** {10} 4-6' (\$24) A medium size, yellow-fleshed dessert apple. The tree is vigorous, spreading, and an annual bearer. Liberty is resistant to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight, and mildew. A good choice for the home gardener. Liberty is an early blooming variety and can pollinate all other early & mid season blooming apple varieties. [4]

**06K Northern Spy Apple:** {5} 4-6' (\$24) A very old-fashioned American heirloom winter apple variety, picked in late October and used through the winter months.

Northern Spy is well known for its winter-hardiness. It is a naturally vigorous variety that may take longer than most apples to come into biennial bearing. [4]

**07K Wolf River Apple:** {10} 4-6' (\$24) Wolf River apples are larger in size, up to 5 inches in diameter, than other common apple varieties. It is tart and juicy and is used more commonly for cooking pies, applesauce and apple butter than eating raw. Wolf River is an old variety of apple tree that is exceptionally cold hardy and ripens mid-September to mid-October. [4]

**08ACN Royal Empire Apple:** {7 potted} 5-7' (\$35) The Royal Empire apple tree is a McIntosh type apple with a blend of sweet and tart that is darker red than the regular empire apple tree. The fruit produced is juicy and very crisp, with a creamy white flesh. Excellent for eating, baking, pies and sauce. A super favorite of children and an excellent healthy snack. [4]

**09ACN Macoun Apple:** {4 potted} 5-7' (\$35) Produce very sweet, sugary, crisp apples that have a lovely aroma. They are perfect for both fresh eating and for baking. The flesh is pure white & holds in flavor well when cooked. They are an offspring of the Liberty and is related to the McIntosh. [5]

**10S Winter Banana Apple:** These apples are an heirloom variety - interesting flavors with an old-fashioned sort of beauty that are pale yellow with a faint pink blush. The flavor is a combination of sweet and tart, with a definite banana aroma and very dense & crisp texture. The Winter banana apple's dense texture makes for a better eating experience when sliced - pairing with a cheese would be an excellent choice. The tart-sweet flavor of this apple also makes it an excellent cooking apple. To store, keep apples as cold as possible in the refrigerator. Ripens late October. [4]

#### Peaches (4-6' \$23.50)

**11K Reliance Peach** {10} Hardest yellow-fleshed freestone peach available. Medium sized, roundish, yellow fleshed peach that ripens mid August. [4]

**12K Hale Haven Peach:** {10} The Hale-Haven Peach, *Prunus persica*, is a high quality peach that has a deep orange color all over with deep blushes of carmine. The brilliant color of the fruit appears several days before the fruit ripens. The pulp of the Hale Haven peach is firm, juicy, very sweet and richly flavored, being fully ripe in August. The Hale-Haven peach is a freestone peach has an excellent flavor so is good for desserts, canning and freezing. Easy to grow, it needs clear, hot weather during the growing season and requires well-drained soil as well as a regular fertilizing program. No pollinator needed. Pink flowers slightly fragrant. [5]

## Nectarine

**13K Hardy Red Nectarine:** {3} 4-6' (\$24) Mild, slightly tangy juicy freestone fruit. Resists brown rot and leaf spot. Ripens mid to late August. The hardiest nectarine. Self fruitful. [4]

**14K Fantasia Nectarine:** {3} 4-6' (\$24) A self fruitful tree that has large yellow freestone flesh that remains firm when ripe. Most adaptable of all fruit trees for home gardens. [5]

## Pears

**15K Century Asian Pear:** {3} 4-6' (\$25) Century Pears are self-fruitful, pollinated by Housi or other Asian pears. The Century is best flavored, most popular Asian pear that is juicy, sweet, mild-flavored, and crisp like apple.

Asian pears combine the flavor and sweetness of pears with the crunchiness of crisp apples. Also known as pear-apples, salad pears, and crystal pears. Cold hardy, drought resistant, heat tolerant. Susceptible to fire blight and codling moth. Fruit should be thinned to one per spur. [4]

**16K Housi Asian Pear:** {3} 4-6' (\$25) The fruit's most notable trait is its extremely juicy, mild and sweet taste. Has a little of the tang in many apples and is a delight in any salad. It is easy to grow. They bloom late, avoid frost-kill, and ignore most pests and diseases. Hosui can bear large, gold-brown fruits as quickly as one year, then hundreds of pears per tree in 8 or 9 years. Fruits ripened on the tree by July can hold at least two months. Ripen July to Sept. depending on location. Hosui may be self-fruitful, but for best results plant with another Asian pear. Plant 10' apart.

## Plums

**17ACN Shiro Plum:** {3} 4-6' potted (\$23) No other yellow plum touches the Shiro in both appearance and taste. Sheer, golden yellow skin covers the juiciest of crisp plum flesh. Delicious to eat fresh or canned. Ripens early Aug [4].

**18ACN Santa Rosa Plum:** {1} 4-6' potted (\$25) Fruit is large, attractive, dark reddish purple color with red flesh. Fruit is firm and of good quality. One of the most frequently planted Japanese plums that produce heavy annual crops of excellent quality purple-red clingstone fruit in July. [5]

**19K Fellenberg (Italian) Plum:** {5} 4-6' (\$23.50) Fruit ranges in color from green-yellow to almost black. A higher sugar content makes it possible to sun-dry the fruit without having it ferment at the pit. They are late bloomers and are better adapted to areas with late frosts or cool, rainy, spring weather. Will produce 3-5 bushel annually. Prune to avoid formation of V-crotches. Once mature, trees will require little pruning. [5]

**20K Green Gage Plum:** {5} 4-6' (\$23.50) A very popular old fashioned English plum that grows well over a wide range of climates. It is a greenish-yellow, very sweet, and juicy plum. The self-fertile Green Gage plum produces heavy crops that ripen in July. [5]

**21K Stanley Plum:** {5} 4-6' (\$23.50) Sweet enough to dry without being pitted. European freestone bears huge crops of plump, dark blue fruits. Ripens in Sept. Self-pollinating. [5]

## Cherry

**22K Stella Cherry:** {6} 4-6' (\$24) This large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry is self-fruitful. It is a great pollinator for the Bing cherry tree. The flesh is almost black in color. It is an excellent cherry for fresh eating and is also resistant to cracking. Tree bears at a young age. [5]

**23K Montmorency Cherry:** {6} 4-6' (\$24) The most popular cherry in America. It is hardy sour cherry tree. The Montmorency cherry is large, delicious, and is a dark red fruit with rich, firm flesh. [4]

## Raspberries

Red, Gold and Purple Raspberries and Blackberries should not be planted within 75 to 100 feet of Black Raspberries.

**24K-H Boyne Raspberries:** {32 sets} (5/\$12) an early-season variety that is extremely winter hardy. It consistently produces deep-red, medium-sized berries that are easy to pick.. canes are upright and sturdy and will not need trellising to support the abundant fruit production. [3]

**25K Royalty Purple Raspberries** {20 sets} (5/\$24) Fruits are large and so sweet they're delicious without sugar. That means this is ideal for pies and jams. Fully winter hardy. Has "multiple" insect resistance including immunity to "raspberry aphid," (Geneva Exp. Sta.). Late season bearing, avoids spring frost damage. [4]

**26H Encore Raspberries:** {12 sets} (5/\$12) This everbearing, highly productive rasp-berry bears velvety fruit that melts in your mouth. Ripens to perfection mid-summer.

## Blueberries - Highbush

**27K Blueray Blueberries:** The large dark-blue berries (60 berries/cup), with sweet, high-quality flavor, make Blueray an excellent choice for the home gardener. This is a mid-season, very hardy, upright vigorous bush that produces large, light- blue, highly tart fruit.. [3]

**28K Jersey Blueberries:** Many people who know their berries will tell you this old variety is the best. The berries are not as big as some of the others, but many think the taste is sweeter, and the well-shaped bush is certainly a more handsome shrub. Jersey is an outstanding variety for the home landscape and with its famous cold hardiness you will be harvesting for years. Grows 4-5' tall.

**29K Berkeley Blueberries:** 'Berkeley' is a late mid-season blueberry and carries attractive powder blue fruit with a pleasing light flavor and good dessert quality. An excellent producer in mild climates. Bright yellow canes grow 5-6 ft wide and tall. Approx. 70 berries per cup.

## Edibles

**31B Asparagus, Jersey King:** {30} 5/\$5 All-male and highly disease resistant, these heavy producing crowns require little care after planting. Make a trench about 8 inches deep in soil with good drainage and plenty of sun. Space plants about 18 inches apart in the row. [3]

## Herbs & Medicinals

**32RT Tansy, (*Tanacetum vulgare*):** \$4 potted. Grows 3-5'. Produces button-shaped yellow flowers in cluster in later summer. Best as a decorative hardy border for gardens and is known to repel flying insects and ants. [2]

**33RT Comfrey, (*Sysphytum officinale*):** {20}\$4 potted. Well-known for its soothing properties. Contains allantoin, promotes healing of skin and bone; also demulcent for lung and throat. Hanging bell-like pink flowers much loved by bumblebees open in early summer. Stem and leaves covered with bristly hairs. Vigorous spreading plant that demands space; control with regular harvest. 3'-5' tall. [3]

**34RT Spearmint, (*Mentha spicata*)** \$3 potted Classified as the crown jewel of the mint world. British breeds of green mint are known as spearmint. Very popular for flavoring cold soups, beverages and meats. Likes moist soil but grows almost anywhere. Fertilize annually in late summer. When harvesting,, the best leaves to use are the top bud and first two leaves; pinch out the growing tip rather than cut a whole stem. [2]

**35RT Woolly Apple Mint, (*Mentha suaveolens*)** \$3 potted Perennial with vigorous growth habit, reaches 1-2' feet in height. Also called "Round Leaf Mint." Has woolly foliage and a fruity aroma. Makes a nice tea though the fuzzy leaves are somewhat more powdery than other mint varieties when dried. [2]

**36RT Chives, Onino, (*Allium schoenoprasum*)** \$3 potted Chives are an important culinary belonging to the esteemed Alliaceae family. They have delicate cylindrical, deep green leaves that have a passing resemblance to long grass. [2]

**37RT Catnip or catmint (*Nepeta cataria*)**\$4 potted Plants have fuzzy, grayish-green leaves and small, white flowers that bloom in the summer. The flowers, leaves and stem are cut while the plants are in full flower and then dried for use in herbal preparations. Taken as a hot infusion, Catnip promotes sweating and is beneficial for colds, flu, and fevers. It is soothing to the nervous system and calming to the stomach. It aids with flatulence, diarrhea, and colic. Commonly used in connection with anxiety, insomnia, and nervousness. Contains a substance (nepetalactone) which has a sedative effect in humans. [2]

## Perennials

**38MC Bleeding Heart-Old-Fashioned,Dicentra spectabilis** {10} \$8 potted) Grows 30 - 36" . Old-fashioned Bleeding Hearts form large, bushy clumps of powdery-green foliage comprised of cut or lobed leaves on fleshy stems. [3]

**39MC False Sunflower, Heliopsis** {10} \$8 potted To 36". A beautiful carefree perennial that puts on a show of semi-double, 2-3 inch wide, golden yellow flowers all summer long. An excellent tall perennial for the back of the flower border. Grows in full sun or part shade, but it performs much better in full sun. Deadheading spent flower heads will extend the flowering time. [3]

**40MC Painted Daisy, Tanacetum** {10} \$8 potted Grows 24-36". Measure 2.5 inches wide and are daisy-like with a bright yellow center. Tanacetum also has interesting ferny foliage much like that of yarrow. Grow in full sun and well-drained soil. It should be divided in the spring or in the fall every 2 years to maintain vigor. [3]

**41MC Spiderwort, Tradescantia** {10} \$8 potted Grows 18 - 24" Triangular, pale pink flowers and slender, frosted blue-green foliage. Each 1-2 inch wide, 3-petaled flower only lasts for one day, but the plants have lots of buds, extending the bloom time up to eight weeks. This long-blooming selection is excellent for naturalizing in wildflower gardens.. Very attractive when planted in a naturalized area or by a pond or stream. [3]

**42MC Primrose, Primula capitata Salvana** {10} \$8 potted. Spring bloomer produces unique button-like flowers atop powdery silver stems. The pinkish violet-blue, trumpet-shaped flowers are held in pincushion-like clusters. Plant in partial shade. Plants will go dormant in hot, dry summer weather unless they are kept well-watered. [4]

**43MC Bee Balm, Monarda 'Raspberry Wine'** {10} \$8 potted. To 30-42". Wine red flowers appear atop the stocky, square stems from midsummer to fall. Full sun is best, but light shade is tolerated. In order to keep plants healthy and vigorous, they should be divided at least every three years in the spring. To prevent fungus from appearing, large clumps should be thinned out so that the air circulates freely around them. The flowers' sweet nectar attracts scores of hummingbirds, butterflies, and bees to the garden. The aromatic foliage smells like mint.

**44DF Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*):** (\$8 potted) {20} The big conical centers of these daisy-shaped flowers are very spiny and coppery yellow-brown with lavender-purple petals on 2 -4' stems. They last forever when cut. Sub-zero hardy but withstand heat and dry locations. Tolerates wind and drought once established. They draw pollinators like butterflies and bumblebees, smell sweet and the chickadees like the seeds. Makes an anti-inflammatory treatment for infected wounds and the bites of reptiles and insects. Grows 20-30" high, multiplies easily. {B}[3]

**45G Bergamo Bee Balm** {14} \$1 per pkg Purple-rose blooms provide long-lasting color! Blooms from late spring to late summer. 20- to 28-in. Tolerant to heat and mildew. Irresistible to butterflies! Direct sow into warm soil or start indoors 4 weeks before last frost. This plant attracts butterflies.

**46MC Astilbe chinensis 'Valerie' Soft** ({10} \$8 potted) Grows 18-20". Bluish-purple plumes are dense and blocky. Heavy bloomer that blossoms in midsummer. Large, bright green leaves are coarse in texture. Astilbes are long-lived perennials that are most comfortable when grown in rich soil and light shade to filtered sun. They will grow in full shade, but will not bloom as prolifically there. Though they are easy to grow, Astilbes have one critical requirement-lots of water. [4]

## Conifers

Call to order 50 or more of any variety of conifers.

## Flowering Bushes

**47RT Forsythia:** {5}potted ready to bloom \$18; {10}bare root \$4. Very fast upright growth to 7'. Plant 3-4' apart for hedge. Deep golden yellow flowers in early spring, more deeply and evenly distributed along the stems than other forsythia. Easily pruned after bloom to maintain desired height. [3] {S, W}

**48LRO Weigela, Red Prince:** (12-18"; \$8) {22} Grows 5-6'. A beautiful dark red flower color in June-August. This plant grows upright and has an arching effect. Has a tendency for a secondary bloom in late summer. [4,5,6] {W}

**49LF Weigela, Variegated** (12-18"; \$11) {16} Grows 3-4'. Charming pink trumpet shaped flowers smoother these 4-5 ft. plants in June. Blooms continue all summer long, enhanced by the distinctive green and white foliage. Extremely hardy plants thrive under any conditions, have a natural dense habit and respond well to light pruning. Sometimes blossoms again in fall. [4]

**50LRO Weigela, florida** (12-18"; \$8) {12} A dense, rounded, deciduous shrub that typically grows to 6-10' tall and to 12' wide due to its drooping habit. Flowers are attractive to humming birds. [4]

**51RO Tree Hydrangea**(1'-2'; \$5) {12} A breathtaking sight! In mid-summer this color-changing Hydrangea tree is covered with snow-white flowers. In August the flowers turn a beautiful bluish-pink. In autumn they turn a royal purple color. Easy to grow and fast growing. [4]

**52L Peppermint Stick Spiraea** (6-12"; \$7) {10} Grows 3', White, pink and red blooms all on one plant! Low, spreading graceful habit. Blooms summer into fall. Pest and disease resistant. [4]



**52L Goldfinger Potentilla** {10} 12-18"; \$8 Large 1 1/4" golden-yellow buttercup-like flowers. Like full sun. Broadly branched mounding habit. [2]

**53RO Mock Orange** (1'-2'; \$5) {12} Mock orange is a deciduous flowering shrub, although you'll occasionally hear people refer to "mock orange trees." Mock orange shrubs exude a citrusy fragrance (the quality of which will vary according to cultivar). The plants bear light green leaves and produce white flowers in late spring / early summer. Grows 8' - 12' tall. [4-8]

**61L Mme Lemoine Lilac** 2 potted \$14 The intensely fragrant double white flower clusters are very heavy and tend to weigh down the sturdy branches, making them easier to inhale the perfume. Grows 4-5'. Doesn't tend to sucker like most other lilacs.

**62L Josee Lilac** 10- potted \$14 This hardy re-blooming lilac loves the sun and is just the right size at 4-6 ft. tall as an accent shrub or grouped as a hedgerow. Fragrant, lavender-pink panicles of trumpet-shaped flowers are 4-5 in. long and can't be beat as cut flowers.

## Lilacs

**54L Wonderblue Lilac** (12-18"; \$11) {10}

[[1- potted \$16]] Some call it Little Boy Blue, for its entrancing color and petite size. At just 5 feet high, this lovely lilac is perfect for the smaller garden and produces fragrant, sky-blue blossoms in mid-season. [3]

**55K Ludwig Spaeth Lilac** \$14

{3} A must have variety for Lilac lovers, Ludwig Spaeth is prized for its large fragrant deep violet flower trusses that compliment lighter colored Lilacs so well. The shrub has a more upright form reaching up to 12' X 6' wide making it an excellent hedge and screen plant for larger areas. [3]



**56K Angel White Lilac** \$14 {6} Pure white flowers



cover this fast grower that blooms later in the Lilac blooming season. This hybrid provides more flowers than other lilacs and has demonstrated good heat resistance making it a better choice for warmer areas. Grows 8-10' tall with a 6-8' spread. [3]

**57L Later Lilac** (12-18"; \$10) {10} 6-9' h X 4-9' w Lilac-type clusters of flowers in very late spring (after common lilac). Full sun; moist, well-drained soils are best; tolerates alkaline soils. Has fragrant rosy lilac to white flowers in 3- to 6-inch clusters. [2]

**58L Miss Kim Lilac** (6-12"; \$9) {10} Grows to 10'. A medium large tree with large, sometimes drooping panicles. Grows 5-6' Late blooming, compact shrub with fragrant lavender blue flowers, dark glossy. [3]

**59L Peking Lilac** (18-24"; \$10) {25} A small tree lilac that may grow to 20'. Flowers creamy-white, densely crowded in large panicles. Golden bark, sometimes exfoliating in rich brown flakes. [3]

**60L James MacFarlane Lilac** 12-18"; \$11 {10} Clusters of single pink flowers bloom two weeks after Common Purple Lilac. Wonderful, spicy fragrance. Very cold hardy, will tolerate some seasonal drought once established. Introduced by University of New Hampshire. Grows to 8'. [2]

**63L Pochontas Lilac** 2 potted \$14 Grows to 12'. Hardy, vigorous, and early blooming with dark maroon buds opening to masses of deep violet, fragrant flowers.

**64L President Grevy Lilac** 3 potted \$14 These exceptionally fragrant lilacs bloom all summer and are superb for cutting—the perfume will fill your whole house! This impressive variety grows 8-12' tall.

**65RT Old Fashion purple Lilac** potted \$8. Grows 12 - 20'. Syringa Vulgaris, is well-known and loved by gardeners all over the world for its beauty and fragrance; one of the most powerful fragrances emitted by a plant.
